Travel Documents, Embassies & Inoculations

Wherever you live, and whatever your nationality, you must always check that you have the correct documentation before you begin your journey. Passport, visa, and inoculation regulations may vary by destination and may change from time to time. It is the sole responsibility of the guest to obtain, and have available when necessary, the appropriate valid travel and health documents such as passports, visas, vaccination certificates, etc., that are necessary for air travel and re-entry into the country of origin.

Passports

A passport valid for at least 6 months beyond your scheduled return date is required for all travelers to enter Indonesia. In addition, **at least two blank pages in your passport are required for an Indonesia entry stamp.** Visa pages with stains or ink from other pages in the passport are not usable. We recommend that you make two copies of the Data Page of your passport – leaving one with friends or family at home and keeping the other in your luggage, separate from your passport. Carrying your passport at all times during travel is suggested, unless you have access to a hotel safe.

Visas

Effective June 2015 Indonesia added these following 30 countries to their “visa-free” list at certain ports of call (including Bali):

Austria, Bahrain, Belgium, Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Canada, Chile, Czech Republic, Denmark, Ecuador, Finland, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Hungary, Italy, Kuwait, Japan, Laos, Macau, Malaysia, Mexico, Morocco, Myanmar, New Zealand, Norway, Oman, Peru, People’s Republic of China, Philippines, Poland, Qatar, Russia, Singapore, South Korea, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand, The Netherlands, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, United States of America, Vietnam.

If you are a citizen of one of these countries (above), at this time you do *not* need to obtain an Indonesian visa for your March 2016 visit.

However, citizens of the following countries DO require an Indonesian visa, which may be purchased on arrival in Indonesia (Visa on Arrival - VOA):

Algeria, Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Egypt, Estonia, Fiji, Greece, Iceland, India, Ireland, Latvia, Libya, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Maldives, Malta, Monaco, Panama, Portugal, Romania, Saudi Arabia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Suriname, Taiwan, Tunisia.

All visitors entering Indonesia by way of Visa-on-Arrival (VOA) must have a return ticket out of the country on their person when passing through immigration into the country (E-tickets are acceptable). Visas on arrival are approximately US\$25 for 30 days (subject to change).

Citizens of all other countries should contact the Indonesian Consulate for information on how to obtain an Indonesian visa. ([Button 2](#))

IMPORTANT: Indonesian visa policies may change at any time. As such, it is the guests' responsibility to identify and to obtain all the necessary visas before commencing their travels.

Registration with US Embassies ([Button 5](#))

Travel registration is a free service provided by the US Government to US citizens who are traveling to, or living in, a foreign country. Registration allows you to record information about your upcoming trip abroad that the Department of State can use to assist you in case of an emergency.

Non-US travelers, who are interested in registering their travel abroad, should contact their embassies and/or consulates for their registration guidelines and recommendations.

Traveling with a Minor Child (under the age of 18)

Any minor child, under the age of 18, who participates in a TravelQuest tour must be accompanied by an adult and supervised by that adult during the tour. The adult travel companion shall be responsible for the conduct and care of the minor tour participant. **Please contact TravelQuest immediately if you are traveling with a minor child** so that we can further pursue proper documentation.

Inoculations / Vaccines ([Button 6](#))

It is not required to have any specific inoculations/vaccinations for Indonesia. However, malaria is a serious concern in certain areas and preventative treatment is recommended. Hepatitis A and typhoid are also of concern according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). All travelers should be up to date on routine vaccinations while traveling to any destination. Information on vaccinations and other health precautions can be found via the CDC website. Consult your healthcare professional, or local health department, for any inoculations you may require.

On March 8 we will be driven to the airport (DPS) to board TQ's Eclipse Charter flight (a Boeing 737-800) to Palu, Sulawesi. **IMPORTANT:** The baggage allowance on our group charter flights is restricted to **20 kg (44 lbs.)** per person of checked-in baggage, and one carry-on bag weighing no more than **7 kg (15 lbs.)**. Bags will be weighed at check-in at our private counter.

It is each traveler's responsibility to bring with them all necessary travel documents including passport.

Travel Tips and What to Expect

Apps Travel Apps recommended by TravelQuest ([Button 7](#))

For those of you who use mobile devices or tablets when you travel, we have provided a recommended list of available apps to serve as up-to-date resources during your trip abroad.

Baggage Allowance - Be sure to check with your international airlines for their baggage restrictions. One suitcase per person, please. Carry-on bags and telescopes are permitted.

IMPORTANT: The baggage allowance on our group charter flights to Palu, Sulawesi is restricted to 20 kg (44 lbs.) per person of checked-in baggage, and one carry-on bag weighing no more than 7 kg (15 lbs). Bags will be weighed at check-in.

Clothing

Casual clothing will be the rule on this trip. During your visits to some local communities, all guests will be required to dress respectfully. Ladies must have their shoulders and thighs covered. Gentlemen should have their shoulders covered also. Carrying a sarong is a simple solution to covering oneself when necessary.

The region has a tropical climate appropriate to its proximity to the equator, making it much easier to get sunburned. We strongly recommend a high-index sunscreen, along with a large brim hat, polarized sunglasses, and cotton t-shirts for sun protection. Indonesia's equatorial bearings also make occasional rain showers a distinct possibility, so a light rain jacket and small, portable umbrella are recommended.

Suggested Packing List ([Here](#))

Currency

The **rupiah (Rp or IDR)** is the official currency of Indonesia. Informally, Indonesians also use the word "*perak*" ('silver' in Indonesian) in referring to rupiah. As of January 2016 the exchange rate is about \$1 = 13,000 IDR. You will need spending money to cover souvenirs, incidental expenses, and meals not included in the tour. We recommend that you bring to Indonesia approximately \$250-300 USD per person cash and a MasterCard or Visa (American Express and Discover are not always accepted). Credit/debit cards are used throughout Indonesia, although not typically for small purchases. ATMs are available in most areas (including hotels and airports); check with your issuing bank to be sure that your card & PIN will work in Indonesia (must be a 4-digit PIN). If you are exchanging currencies at a Bureau de Change or similar, always ask for big notes such as Rp100,000 or 50,000 notes.

Note: As of July 2015, US\$ are no longer accepted in stores. We recommend that you change dollars into rupiah's at the airport (or withdraw from your ATM card) while waiting for your baggage.

Dining

The included group meals will be at hotels or favorite local restaurants. Set buffet menus will be of very well prepared fresh, local foods. Expect to have beef, chicken or some variety of fish most days; contact TravelQuest immediately if you have special dietary requirements, and we will do our best to accommodate your needs. Lunch and dinners included on our itinerary will offer water, tea and coffee; breakfasts will be buffets at our hotels.

Do's and Don'ts in Indonesia

When visiting Indonesia visitors should observe local customs and practices. Some common courtesies and customs are:

- The traditional greeting or salam, which resembles a handshake with both hands but without the grasp, is commonly used.
- Handshakes are generally acceptable for both men and women although some Muslim ladies may acknowledge introductions to gentlemen by merely nodding and smiling.
- Shoes must always be removed when entering a home.
- Shoes must be removed when entering places of worship, such as mosques and temples. Some mosques provide robes and scarves for female visitors.
- It is polite to accept drinks, which are usually offered to guests.
- The right hand is always used when eating with ones hands or giving and receiving objects.
- The thumb of the right hand, with four fingers folded under, is the preferred way to point at places, objects or persons, instead of using the right forefinger.
- Most places of worship usually allow visitors to take photos but it is polite to ask for permission beforehand.
- A few basic words of Bahasa Indonesia will take you a long way in Bali. Try selamat pagi (good morning), tolong (please) and terima kasih (thank you), for starters.

Electricity (Button 8)

In Bali and Indonesia you can expect the **2-pin socket and plug** as used in larger parts of Europe. **The pins are round**, not flat or rectangular.

Voltage: 230 V

Frequency: 50 Hz

Power sockets: type C / F

Health Considerations

There are certain inherent risks involved in participating in this tour, and you must accept these risks as your own. Prior to departure, it is your responsibility to take all appropriate medical advice as to whether or not you are fit enough to undertake this trip. If you have any questions, please call TravelQuest immediately at 800-830-1998.

Participants should be able to enjoy comfortably paced, easy to moderate walks. Travelers need to be able to climb into and out of buses and occasionally carry their own luggage.

Malaria might be present in certain areas. Insect repellent is a must. Malaria can be a problem in Borneo and Sulawesi. Discuss with your doctor what the right preventative medication for you would be.

The biggest concern for our travelers is *heat and dehydration*. Available bathrooms may be imperfect, but this should NOT dissuade people from drinking plenty of water. Travelers are encouraged to bring an umbrella, and drink lots of fluids.

Bring enough prescription medicines (in its container/bottle, if possible with the doctor's prescription) to last the duration of the tour. It is also advisable to bring protective sunscreen, sunglasses, a hat, and lip balm for outdoor activities.

Insurance

All travelers have been provided a basic travel insurance policy, which is included in your trip cost, through TravelEx Insurance. You may have upgraded this policy or purchased additional insurance elsewhere. We recommend you bring you bring copies of these policies with you. Nyepi (New Year) - March 9, 2016

Nyepi Day in Bali is a New Year's celebration unlike anywhere else on the planet. Also known as Bali's celebration of the Saka New Year and the Bali Day of Silence, it is ultimately the quietest day of the year, when all of its inhabitants abide by a set of local rules that bring all routine activities to a complete halt. The roads all over Bali are void of any traffic and nobody steps outside of his or her home premises.

While we won't be experiencing the actual day of Nyepi, as it coincides with our eclipse in Palu, Sulawesi, we will be experiencing the preparations in the days leading up to Nyepi. *For more information on Nyepi* ([Click](#))

Photography

Bring a camera with which you are comfortable. It is also wise to bring zip-lock plastic bags to protect your camera from rain, moisture and dust.

Digital Photography - If you choose to bring a digital camera, please remember to bring extra memory cards and sticks, as well as extra batteries and chargers, as necessary.

On Excursions - Please note that taking pictures may be restricted in certain areas and situations. Always check with your local guide before photographing local residents, and never simply point a camera at someone. The staff and local guides will provide further information about local restrictions and customs.

Safety

TravelQuest encourages travelers to stay with the group and enjoy the areas provided by your guide.

As with any trip abroad, take sensible measures to protect yourself and your belongings. Avoid having bags obviously on show and carry only essential items. Take particular care of your passport and bankcards, and avoid venturing out alone. Here are some tips for keeping yourself and your belongings secure:

- Carry small amounts of money only, and use a money belt worn underneath your clothes rather than a wallet. Don't flash large amounts of cash or other valuables in public.
- Carry your passport at all times, unless you have access to a safe in a hotel where your passport and money can also be safely stored.
- Leave expensive jewelry and accessories at home.
- Keep purses and backpacks zipped, and don't put valuables in outside pockets. Stay aware of your surroundings and belongings. Be careful of distractions that may be staged to make you more vulnerable for a pickpocket.
- Don't hang your backpack or purse on the back of your chair at a restaurant or café. Instead, place your belongings near your feet or hold them on your lap. Be especially vigilant at sidewalk cafés.
- Know how to reach your bank and credit card companies from abroad to cancel your cards if necessary. Investigate phone numbers and policies before you leave, and consider keeping a copy of this information during your travels.
- Avoid walking alone at night or in isolated areas. Avoid political events or street protests.

Shopping

Bali's shopping is legendary. Not only are visitors spoiled for choice by the variety of goods on offer, there's also a rich array of shopping venues and styles from market stalls to high end shops. In local markets bartering is common, however, once you enter a barter, it is polite to then buy the object. Enjoy the barter; stay jovial while trying to score a deal.

Smoking

Smoking in Indonesia is common. However, smoking is prohibited on public transport, places of worship, and some public places, although smoke-free zones are not uniform. Designated smoking areas are provided, and must be identified by the traveler.

Spending Money

The official currency is the Indonesia Rupiah (IDR or Rp). As of January 29, 2016, the exchange rate is about \$1 USD/13,800 IDR. Use an ATM in the airport to acquire some cash in Rupiah.

For our trip, you will need spending money to cover souvenirs, incidental expenses, and meals not included in the tour. We recommend that you bring to the Bali approximately \$250-\$300 USD per person in cash plus a debit card and/or a MasterCard or Visa credit card (American Express and Discover are not always accepted). Both credit and debit cards are commonly used throughout Indonesia. Remember to contact your bank prior to departure to make sure that your credit/debit card will work while traveling abroad. Also note that your cards must have a 4-digit PIN, not a longer 6-digit PIN.

Telecommunications

Contact your mobile phone provider to see if your phone will work in Indonesia, and what roaming charges may apply.

Time

Indonesia will be running on WITA (Central Indonesian Time), and will be +13 hours EDT (New York). For example, on Wednesday, January 20, 2016, at noon in New York, it is 23:00 (11PM) WITA.

Tipping

Tipping in our CORE program is included. Of course, if you feel an extra tip is in order, this is up to you. If you feel you have received superior service, the rule-of-thumb for tipping is:

US\$2 Driver - per person, per day - US\$5 Guide – per person, per day - US\$5 Boat Captain – per person, per day

Water

Drink only bottled or boiled water or carbonated drinks in cans and bottles. Water will be available during meals and a limited amount of bottled water will be provided on group excursions. Additional water will be available at your own expense.

Weather

Bali is approximately 8 degrees south of the equator, the weather is tropical. Temperatures in March will be hot! Expect weather highs to be around 80-90° F with 85-90% humidity. Remember to keep hydrated - drink lots of water!

Indonesia will be running on WITA (Central Indonesian Time), and will be +13 hours EDT (New York). For example, 11:30 am Thursday in New York it is 00:30AM Friday in Bali, or 11:00 AM Thursday at TravelQuest in Prescott, AZ Bali it is 2:00AM Friday in Bali.

Light clothes with rainwear are generally ideal for travelling around Indonesia. Warmer clothes are needed for cool evenings and upland areas. It is generally regarded inappropriate to wear scant clothing anywhere other than the beach or at resorts. Women should observe the dress code in Muslim areas and in places such as temples, which requires shoulders and legs to be kept covered (sleeveless tops are okay, but carry a lightweight scarf that you can wrap around your shoulders). Don't forget to pack your umbrella!

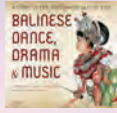

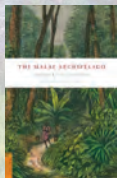
